




1. Here's what it looks like when I started dragging the class list dock bar. At this point I've moved the mouse cursor to the right and up, but not fully to the top of the screen. The indicator box lines are still quite small so don't release the mouse button yet:




2. Now, I've reached the point where it's still going to be docking inside the form, I haven't gone too far such that it will be a free floating dock bar. Notice how the lines are going the full width of the child form area now:




3. Here's what it looks like when I release the mouse. We have the class list the same width as the properties and methods as desired:




4. Now, we want to move the editor window so it takes up all of the right hand side of the form. In this screen shot, I've started dragging the editor container but haven't gone far enough to the right yet for it to snap the indicator box to the full form height so the indicator box is still showing the full form width:



5. And here's what it looks like when I get very close to the right hand edge. The indicator box is now the full form height:



6. And here's what it looks like when I release the mouse. We have the desired layout, but the editor pane is still too narrow:



7. Finally, here's what it looks like when I drag the resize bar to give more space for the editor window:
